Burnell Curtis moved to adjourn. Cynthia Crawford seconded, all agreed, and the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.

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

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
It was Friday morning and off to yet another plane flight out of IAH. Except this time, it was for a vacation trip to Laguna Seca for the six-hour American Le Mans and GT race. All good. My fellow banking colleagues Rick Copeland and Davis Allman (both Porsche owners and club members) accompanied me and our son Max. This may be Max's last trip for a bit, where he can ditch school on Friday, as he starts at UT's business school in the fall. The good karma about this is that the first US F-1 race in some time was announced today, and it's in Austin!


Arriving in San Francisco, we rented a car for the one and one-half hour trip to the Laguna Seca Raceway. The track is 95 miles south down 101 and about seven miles west of Monterey. We stayed in Monterey.

The Laguna Seca raceway was opened in 1957, after a fatal accident in the Pebble Beach Road Races, when in 1956 a Ferrari clashed into a tree killing its driver. The track was developed at a cost of \$1.5 million at the edge of Fort Ord. In 1974, the Army transferred the 500 plus acre site to Monterey County for the Monterey County Parks Department. The not-for-profit Sports Car Racing Association of the Monterey Peninsula (SCRAMP) operates the racetrack. SCRAMP was formed to "benefit local charitable and non-profit organizations and to promote the economic vitality of Monterey through the encouragement, solicitation, organization, sponsorship and perpetuation of motorsports events in the vicinity of the Monterey Peninsula." Its earnings are given to charity. A great public-private arrangement.

The track is 2.3 miles long, with 300 feet of elevation change. The eleven-turn course is famous for the Corkscrew at Turns 8 and 8A. This is a blind apex at the highest point on the course. The slope is a challenge for the drivers, as they try to keep their forward balance, while turning, and yet not scrape their front end at the beginning of the drop.







We arrived Friday at Laguna Seca Raceway about 1:00pm after stopping for provisions in Salinas, just east of the track. We took in practice laps and the qualifying for GT, GTC, LMP, LMPC and GT3 Challenge.

The weather varied greatly across the course with some of the areas extremely windy and other areas, much less so. Fortunately, it was sunny most of the time. Going from the temperate green climate of Monterey to the more desert terrain of Salinas reminded me of traveling from La Jolla inland a few miles to Miramar. It never ceases to amaze me how much the California climate changes a few miles from the coast—a desert on the cold waters of the Pacific.

We concluded that evening with dinner in Monterey at the Fish House, a small local haunt on Del Monte that my oldest brother had recommended. It was so good we went there Saturday night too.

Unsure about parking, we left for the track Saturday morning at about 9:00 am, with a 2:30 pm race start for the six-hour race. We had bought folding chairs and watched much of the practice from the Corkscrew. We left our chairs there to tour the vendors and paddock. After lunch and buying a few t-shirts, we toured the pre-race paddock.

Just before the beginning of the race, we began the trek back up the hill to watch the race. Fortunately our chairs were still there, for a front row seat at the Corkscrew. The Corkscrew, at the top of the highest hill, is a short walk to a great vantage point for most of the track. As the race wore on, the GT cars were closely bunched. There were eight different cars leading at times – three Ferraris, two BMW's, two Corvettes and the Flying Lizard Porsche.

As the temperatures fell, we spent the last half hour of the race at the Number Two hairpin turn, in our rental car. We had parked it earlier that morning just for this purpose. We watched as the number 90 Rahal Letterman BMW M3 GT (piloted that day by Dirk Mueller and Joey Hand) led the number 45 Flying Lizard Motorsports Porsche 911 GT3 RSR (driven by Joerg Bergmeister and Patrick Long), by just a few car lengths. Joey Hand in the M3 gained the GT lead with 33 minutes to go when Long came in the pits for fuel only.

With eight minutes to go, far from our view on turn 11, as the green flag signaled the final restart, the number 45 GT3 RSR with Patrick Long at the helm passed the number 90 M3 to take the lead in GT.The top three finishes in GT would be Porsche, BMW and Corvette, with the Porsche ahead by .0365 seconds, after the six hours. The three GT's took fifth, sixth and seventh overall.

For the second straight race, the HPD ARX-01c driven by David Brabham, Simon Pagenaud and Marino Franchitti took first overall in LMP. The Porsche RS Spyder of Klaus Graf, Sascha Maassen and Memo Gidley took second in LMP.

Two Oreca FLM09's took third and fourth overall in LMPC.



In the Porsche GT3 Cup class, the Black Swan Racing car co-piloted by the Bleekemolen brothers from the Netherlands took seventeenth overall and won GTC. They led all six hours.

Next scheduled stop is Sebring. We decided we would all meet again at Sebring in March for the twelve hour race, our first time to that venue.

Zwart Wins Pikes Peak Time Attack Class With Porsche 911 GT3 Cup; Breaks Record by 38 Seconds while Finishing Sixth Overall - Ahead of Every Productionbased Car Entered

Colorado Springs - June 27, 2010 - Jeff Zwart, from Woody Creek, Colorado, driving the specially- prepared Luminox Watch Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race car, has won and set a new record in the 2WD Time Attack class in Sunday's 88th running of the Pikes Peak Hillclimb.

Zwart, now a seven-time Pikes Peak class winner, not only broke Rhys Millen's 2009 class record by 38 seconds (after smashing his qualifying record by 18 seconds), but went faster than all but five of the entire field - three Unlimited Class and two Open Wheels cars, all with 600plus horsepower. His 911 GT3 Cup car also beat all the production based race cars entries, 2WD and 4WD. Nobulhiro Tajima, from Japan, won the hillclimb overall in an eight-cylinder, turbocharged Suzuki 4WD one-off race car with an Unlimited Class entry. Zwart said the key to his victory was the confidence that build up every time he drove the car.

"In my previous six victories - all in Porsche street-based turbo cars - I spent most of my practice time trying to tame the car to fit this difficult course; With this Porsche 911 Cup car, it was clear to me from the beginning that the car was challenging me to drive my best, and I went faster every time I stepped behind the wheel. Each time I thought I was asking too much from the car, especially when I carried maximum speed into one of those hairpins, the Porsche responded and challenged me to push even harder," said Zwart.

He also repeated his amazement from Friday's qualifying session that the normally-aspirated car didn't lose horsepower from its 9,000-foot-elevation start and the 14,000foot finish line. A combination of the 450-hp, 3.8-liter Porsche Cup car engine and expert engine map adjustments from Porsche Motorsport North America gave Zwart the performance of a lifetime.

Zwart again praised the Pirelli road racing rain tires, which he felt held their grip evenly on both the gravel

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and tarmac surfaces, a necessity as the course has been transformed from all gravel to half and half. Next year, with two more miles of the 12-mile course scheduled for paving, road-racing-based tires will make more sense than ever. The team made some adjustments to tire pressures on all four wheels prior to qualifying. Pirelli had developed a tire for Zwart based on the rain tire they use for the Rolex Grand-Am series.

"Without Luminox Watches, Porsche Motorsport North America, and Pirelli tires support, this victory would not have been possible," said Zwart.

Porsche Motorsport started with a 2007 Cup car, updated it to 2010 specifications, and installed a new 450 horsepower 3.8-liter engine currently in use in the Patron GT3 Challenge, American Le Mans Series Challenge Class, and the Porsche Supercup series. The engine management mapping was modified to perform well in high altitude as the race starts at 9,390 feet and finishes at the summit, 14,110 feet above sea level, and ride height was increased for the gravel sections of the course. The underbody was also modified to protect the car from gravel and stones similar to rally competition.


Zwart has now won his class at Pikes Peak - all in Porsches - in 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2002 and 2010, setting new class records four times. Most recently, before this weekend, he co- drove a Porsche Cayenne with Pikes Peak veteran Paul Dallenbach at the challenging TransSyberia Rally (Moscow to Mongolia) in 2007. He also has an SCCA PRO Rally Championship (1990) and a SCORE Baja 1000 class win (2004) to his credit.

The Porsche 911 GT3 Cup car, built on the same assembly line in Stuttgart as the street-legal Porsche 911s, is raced all over the world in the Porsche Supercup series as well as various Porsche Carrera Cup and Challenge Cups, including IMSA Patron GT3 Challenge. New last year was the addition of the American Le Mans Series Challenge class, where the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup cars contest the full endurance series run by the Le Mans racers.

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
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
