Ask yourself this: do you want your teen learning how to control his car in a slow speed, regulated environment with an instructor by his side or on the Katy Freeway in the rain?

The next step up the driving ladder is our national renowned High Speed Drivers' Education Course. We have DE events scheduled for the Texas World Speedway in College Station on February 4-5. Registration will open on January 4 at noon. These events fill very quickly, so be sure to sign up early.

To round out the driving, our Texas Two Step Club Race will be at TWS on March 16-18. This event features skilled drivers in actual wheel to wheel racing. If you're like me and are not at this level, try to come out to the event anyway – it's really something to see and it's free! We are planning to have our traditional Tour to the Club Race on Saturday, March 17, so stay tuned. Greg Platt moved to adjourn, Mike Globe seconded, all agreed and the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.





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

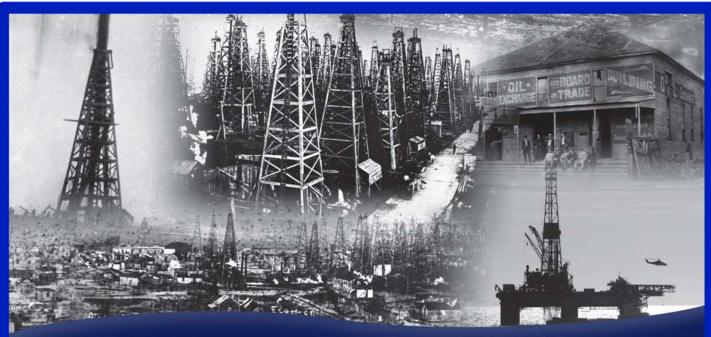


Stingaree Restaurant. We arranged for a private dining area for the LSRPCA folks and we were treated to a scrumptious bread pudding.

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

### Porsche World Roadshow in Houston

I attended the Porsche World Roadshow program on Saturday, October 6<sup>th</sup> at Motorsport Ranch (MSR) in Angleton. If you have not been there, the track is about thirty miles south of the South Loop 610. Houston was one of thirteen U.S. cities on the schedule. I attended with our son Max who was in from UT for the weekend and our friends and PCA members Leah and Gene Shiels.



After arrival and registration, we had a short tech session covering some of the safety rules and the format for the program. We reviewed a

presentation on some braking and cornering basics from a Porsche Sport Driving School instructor before splitting into



three groups. The program covered up to three hours. The venue had two separate programs.

The first program was a lead-follow where you could follow an instructor's lead at rapid pace against a variety of driver skill and experience in the cars that follow. The lead-follow was great way to become more familiar with the driving line of the course. There were three sets of cars to keep the program moving.

We were first paired with a Porsche Sport Driving School instructor, as the driver/instructor in a Panamera, who expanded on the rules for the lead-follow before we set out as the lead car. Each of the cars had a radio linked to the lead instructor to keep everything in sync. This was the first time I had been on the MSR track, so this was extremely helpful to understand the layout, elevation changes, the best braking points and the line for each corner. After this high-speed taxi ride, Max and I cycled

through the cars moving to the next car back behind us. We drove each car, then switched as a passenger. The lead car in our group was a Panamera GTS, followed by a Panamera S, then a new 981 Boxster S, a 991 Carrera base model and finally a 991 Carrera S. The cars grew progressively faster as you progressed to the next car, you would have to hold back ever so slightly.

All the cars were equipped with the PDK and Sport plus. We left each car in Sport Plus to keep the revs up, give quicker throttle response and provide faster and more abrupt gear



shifts. I only have the Sport engine mapping on my base 991 PDK, so it was interesting to see the differences.


My wife had has a base Panamera as a loaner a few weeks ago and the Panamera GTS was quite a different car. You could feel the all wheel drive system and the stable transitioning in the corners. Big difference from the V6 powered Panamera.

The Carreras were a special treat in this venue. Both were extremely stable and the Carrera S clearly had an advantage accelerating down the back straight. We were able to accelerate to about 95 miles per hour before hitting our first braking point. Max and I were lucky to be in a group of drivers that all kept a good pace and fairly even spacing, each time out.

The second section was the Technology Drive. This segment was to contrast acceleration of the Hybrid Cayenne and Panamera with their V8 variants. It consisted of an acceleration and then full braking. The Hybrid had better torque off the line, but felt quite a bit heavier.

We concluded after about two hours, it was time well spent.

At dinner that night, all four of us were very impressed with the new 981 Boxster S and how absolutely neutral the car was in the corners. I drove it the hardest of the various cars.



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
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Ann Retzler and Ron Baklarz put together a trip to Natchez Mississippi where six Porsches and nine Porschephiles got to experience a glimpse into the history of Natchez, Mississippi.

Friday morning we met up with Ron and Ann and two other Porsches and headed for Beaumont under a perfect blue sky. There, two other Porsches joined the group. Driving primarily back roads across Louisiana, we found them to be generally free of traffic, scenic and quite enjoyable. Stopping in Alexandria at England Air Park – previously home of England Air Force base and current location of the Alexandria International Airport – we ate at the former officer's club. For you aircraft buffs, on display are an F-86F, A-7D, A-10A, F-105 and F-84F.

From there it was on to Natchez, passing through many cotton fields before crossing over the Mississippi River. The group arrived around 5 p.m. at our weekend accommodations, the Eola Hotel's Guest House. There is a great history on their website, but briefly it was originally built as



a home in the 1840's, since converted to a sixteen room hotel with period furnishings. After checking-in to our rooms, we settle in to get ready for dinner at "Monmouth," an antebellum mansion.

Saturday morning Ron,

Mark and Cathy headed off to Vicksburg, while the rest of us began the antebellum home tour that Ann had arranged for us. These included "Longwood", "Auburn", "Dunleith", "Stanton Hall", "Rosalie" and "Melrose" gardens. Outstanding, all of them, but our personal favorites were "Longwood" and "Dunleith". Longwood is the largest octagonal house in the U.S. and its upper floors were never completed. Duleith is used as a hotel, wedding venue and has an excellent restaurant. The docents were very informative and we learned a great deal about the homes and local history.

Interestingly the Civil War was usually referred to as the "War between the States" and the term servant was used as opposed to slave for those who worked at these homes. The wealthy plantation owners had their slaves and plantations

across the river in Louisiana and had their "town" homes located in Natchez where they lived and entertained. Natchez had a larger number of millionaires per capita than New York. The town was largely spared during the Civil War as it posed no strategic threat and was not located along any major railway.

After the home tour Gill, Agnes, Andrea and I had time to take a quick trip down a small section of the Natchez Trace Parkway. This is a beautiful two-lane road surrounded by National Park land that extends all the way to Nashville. Ron, Mark and Cathy got to enjoy this route on their way back from Vicksburg. We then visited "Natchez Under the Hill" – a historic section underneath the bluff, by the river, that used to be a seedier part of town back in the day.

Saturday night and another wonderful meal, this time at the Castle Restaurant at Dunleith. The restaurant was originally the carriage house and stables and it was built to resemble a castle. I really enjoyed the white chocolate bread pudding!

It was time to go back to Houston Sunday morning, but not without a stop at Coushatta Casino in Kinder Louisiana to eat at their buffet. I tried not to eat too much, but it was a buffet after all....



We thoroughly enjoyed the entire experience. Next time you have an opportunity to go on one of these drives, I highly recommend it. You get the opportunity to go someplace you may not have been before and meet new people. And we especially want to thank Ann and Ron for all of their time and effort they put in to making our "group" trip so enjoyable.

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
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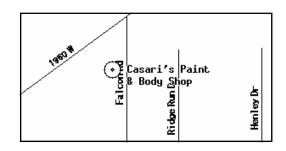
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
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
