

Looking for something to do over the holidays? How about making plans to attend the annual <u>Porsche Parade</u> in 2010 being held at the <u>Pheasant Run Resort</u> from July 3 - 8. The host is the Milwaukee Region, and the Pheasant Run Resort is in St. Charles, Illinois, which is 40 miles west of the Windy City (that would be Chicago).

The Porsche Parade is an annual gathering of PCA members from across the US and from several foreign countries. Last year the Parade in Keystone, Colorado, attracted nearly 2,000 attendees, who drove 650 Porsches from as far away as Alaska. St Charles is approximately 1,000 miles away – a comfortable two day drive through East Texas, Arkansas, along the Missouri-Tennessee border, and across Illinois.

For 2010, we would like to organize a group from the Lone Star Region to take part in the Parade. You can participate in the Concours, Rally, Autocross, Tech Quiz, or one of the many other events, including the driving tours that will take place. You could volunteer to assist with some of these events. Or you can just be there for the activities and banquets, visit with representatives from Porsche, tire manufacturers, and other vendors of Porsche parts in the display area, or just stay a few days and take this opportunity to do some touring of your own before heading home.

On-line Registration will open on March 9th, 2010, and preliminary information is available at http://parade2010.pca.org/. You will get an e-mail notice from PCA, and there will be announcements in the Panorama as March approaches.

Lynn called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Lynn mentioned that the January 9, Saturday Morning Coffee Gettogether is a joint Porsche/Volkswagen meeting. It is planned for the south side of town at the Paradise Coffee Company on Clear Lake Blvd.

Lynn reported that the Swap Meet was a success and raised \$100 which was donated to Magnificat House. The Board recognized Michael Ritchey (not present) who organized the event and Rodger Gay and Porsche of North Houston for providing the location and support for the event.

Joost and Matt reported on the schedule for Performance Driving School and AutoCross events, some of which will be conducted jointly. Currently scheduled are May 15-16 (PDS/AX), July 10 (AX) and November 13-14 (PDS/AX), all at the Houston Police Academy. Joost is looking into adding additional dates and locations for PDS events. Matt reported on the possibility of conducting AutoCross events in conjunction with the BMW club which would be timed and scored for the BMW point series. The BMW AX events are scheduled for the last Sunday of each month. In addition, Matt is working on organizing a

new activity for the LSR -- time trials. These could be held at locations such as Grand Sport and Baytown Raceway. There was a discussion of the costs and facilities available for PDS and AX events at Grand Sport, Houston Police Academy and Baytown Raceway. Matt will also check into the cost and feasibility of contracting with Evolution Performance Driving to provide instructors for AutoCross events.

Matt reported on the brands and compatibility issues of timing equipment which the Board had previously approved purchasing in an amount up to \$2500. Matt recommended purchasing a Race American basic system without the display at this time at a cost of approximately \$2200. This includes a one year subscription to AXware software. Although this is not the system BMW uses, it is compatible with ClubRegistration.net which is preferable. The Board approved Matt's recommendation. Matt also reported that he has relocated to a storage garage on Buffalo Speedway at the 610 loop. The 5' x 10' garage cost is paid through 2010.

Jim Heimer reported that the website now has separate web pages for Autocross and Performance Driving School. He suggested we prepare a short video to place on each page showing visitors what these events are like.

William Wong reported that Club membership stands at 1015 members.

Greg Stewart reported that the February DE was filling up. He also reported that he had received an invitation from Ferrari of Houston to schedule a visit to their facility. The club last visited Ferrari in September, 2008 and the event was very popular.

Sylvia opened a discussion on whether a Concours event should be planned in conjunction with the March Club Race and DE. After much consideration, it was agreed that Concours would sponsor a drive to TWS and plan to participate in parade laps and award fun prizes, returning through Brenham with a stop for dinner. Jim Heimer volunteered to plan the route and arrange for dinner at a restaurant in Brenham. Richard Jackson suggested we send out postcards making the membership aware of the three events occurring together -- the Club Race, DE and Concours outing. Sylvia is planning three Concours this year, one to be held at the Christmas Tree Farm in November.

Jim Troxel reported that all preparations for the Club Race have been made but that volunteers are still needed. Ken Tubman will send out an email asking for volunteers and Richard will add a sign-up for volunteers to ClubRegistration. Jim is working on obtaining sponsorships for the Race. He noted that the Saturday night dinner at Messina Hof Winery is included in the cost of registration not only for the racers but also for the DE drivers. Richard is going to add that information to ClubRegistration and have registrants indicate whether they will attend the dinner. He will also add an option for purchasing additional dinners for family or friends. This will also allow a headcount of the number of people going to Messina Hof. In addition, there was a discussion about arranging for shuttle transportation to and from Messina Hof.

Ron Baklarz reported that plans for a Spring tour in the Whiskey Bay Region of Louisiana were underway.

Old Business:

There was no old business.

New Business:

Lynn raised for Board discussion the Club's policy against sending vendor advertising to members. A dis-

cussion was held regarding the line between thanking sponsors and supporters for their support and promoting the services offered by sponsors and supporters. The Board agreed that sponsors and other supporters provide a valuable service to the Club and are greatly appreciated. Therefore, the Board passed a resolution allowing the recognition of sponsors and supporters verbally at Club events, on emails or other communications to members, and on the Club website. The Board also agreed that providing information about prices or services offered by supporters, whether written by a club member or by the supporter, may create the appearance of advertising on their behalf and was disapproved. However, the Board had no concerns with supporters preparing flyers to be posted or made available to members during events where the supporter is present.

Lynn read a letter from Magnificat House thanking LSR for its 2009 charitable gift and inviting interested members of the Board to visit Magnificat House for dinner and a tour one evening between January 19 - 23.

Lynn reported that the cost of the Porsches and Pirogues dinner cruise is \$10,125 for 75 people, or a cost of \$135/person. It was agreed that the Club would subsidize a portion of the cost and charge only \$75 to attend the event.





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

Revenues (excluding interest) totaled \$40,673.00 and consisted of \$500 PCA National CR rebate; \$163.00 Goody Store; \$35,265.00 DE/CR (via PayPal); and

\$4,695.00 PorscheNaut ad sales and \$50.00 unknown/miscellaneous.

Expenses totaled \$43,357.15 and consisted of: \$18,344.58 for DE (\$14,147.75 track rent, \$2,380.00 corner work, \$600 insurance, \$346.85 concessions, \$416.50 Club Registration, \$135.00 shirts, \$140.53 water, and \$177.95miscellaneous expenses); 6,276.32 Social; \$10,222.60 newsletter printing and mailout; \$231.23 Concours; \$748.00 AX (storage); \$7,500 charity; and \$34.42 for bank charges.

Our current checking account balance is 53,230.31. I have outstanding checks totaling 10,293.62. Our effective balance is therefore \$42,936.69.

We have expected expenditures in the near- term of \$35k related to track rent for upcoming DE and Club Race events.

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
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For the fifth year in a row, it was off to Daytona Beach, Florida, for The Rolex 24 at Daytona. With my 997 tucked away in the garage and a torrential Houston downpour, we left from IAH to Orlando. Daytona Beach is a short one-hour rental car ride from Orlando. My seventeen year-old son Max and my corporate banking colleague David Allman (PCA member and 997S owner) make for our usual travel team.

The race is twenty four hours in duration and is held at Daytona International Speedway. The 3.56 mile course is a combination of portions of the tri-oval banked course and a road course in the infield. This was the 48th running of the race. The race has evolved over the years, starting as a three hour race in 1962, lengthening to 1000 kilometers in 1964 and twenty four hours in 1966. The race was six hours in 1972 and skipped in 1974 due to the then energy crisis. Most teams rotate four drivers. To put the race in perspective, in last year's race, the winning number 58 Brumos Racing Daytona Prototype had 13 driver changes, went through 92 tires, had 27 pit stops, used 550 gallons of fuel in 2,617 miles (4.8 mpg) and compiled 19,110 gear changes (one every 4.5 seconds). Rolex has sponsored the race since 1991. The drivers of the top cars in each class receive a stainless steel Rolex Daytona Cosmograph on the podium.

Two classes race, Prototype in Grand-Am and the GT series. The Daytona Prototypes consist of chassis makers such as Lola, Dallara and Riley, while engines are branded by such manufacturers as Porsche, BMW, Chevrlet and Ford. The cars are referred to by their Engine and Chassis, such as the "Brumos Racing Porsche-Riley". The Daytona GT classes includes the 997, Pontiac and RX8 as popular choices.

The race attracts drivers from all sorts of racing to include, F1, NASCAR and Indy. The race attracts a number of celebrities in racing and the die hard road racing fans. As the tee-shirt one woman was wearing said "Too dumb for opera, too smart for NASCAR".

The race has recently been held one week before the Super Bowl. Local hotels near the track sell out fast, so I bookmark my calendar 330 days before the race and snag a couple rooms on Expedia. We purchase the paddock passes and access to the Grassroots Motorsports tent and more importantly the reserved parking area at Grassroots. The PCA also has a tent at Porscheplatz. This will come in handy with the rains on Saturday.

Having visited Daytona seven times, we have found some good local restaurants including Aunt Catfish's on the River in Port Orange. There is a Carrabba's just across the street from the racetrack that has an hour plus waits on Saturday night.

We arrive at the race track at about 1:00 pm on Friday to watch practice laps and the farmclub for the GT series, the Continental Tire Sports Car Challenge. Saturday morning, we try to arrive my 9:00 am to take in the historic laps, where cars that had previously competed in the 24 to include a Porsche 917, a Porsche 935, as well as an assortment of Lola's and Ferrari's lap the speedway. There are numerous vendors and Max always end up with an assortment of racing tee-shirts.

The race begins at 3:30 pm on Saturday. We usually watch a good deal of the race from the infield grandstand, but heavy rain thinned the crowd. There is a wine and cheese event at six pm. We then usually cut out for dinner returning at about 9:00 pm, spending time in the paddock watching cars come in for repairs. The venue is perfect as you can stand about ten feet away from the cars, watching as the crews furiously work to get the car back on the course. The karaoke at 10:00 pm Saturday night is always a good laugh.

Staying near the track allows you to go to sleep to the roar of the cars and wake to the same. On Sunday the track is usually a little crowded, but cold windy weather on Sunday kept the crowds down.

There were a record number of lead changes. The number 9 Action Express Racing Porsche-Riley, with a Cayenne V-8 prepared by Brumos won the race. The team of Joao Barbosa, Terry Borcheller, Mike Rockenfeller and Ryan Dalziel, beat the Chip Ganassi number 01 BMW-Riley by 52 seconds. The number 01 BMW-Riley had pitted on a false mechanical problem, which ultimately gave the number 9 Porsche-Riley a sufficient margin for victory.

The number 9 Porsche Riley covered 755 laps over Daytona International Speedway's 3.56-mile course for an almost 2,688 mile journey.

The number 59 Brumos Porsche-Riley was Hurley Haywood's final professional competition. After Haywood completed his final lap, his teamate Rapheal Matos had to retire the number 59 with two and a half hours to go. Haywood's Porsche endurance career is probably the most notable of all drivers with five overall wins in the 24 at Daytona, three at the 24 Hours of le Mans and two at the 12 Hours of Sebring.



The TRG Flying Lizard Motorsports entry finished 2nd in GT.

The number 70 SpeedSource / Mazda RX-8 piloted by Bomarito, Ham, Haskell and Tremblay won the GT class. Porsche took second and third in GT. The number 67 TRG Flying Lizard Motorsports Porsche GT3 driven by Bergmeister, Long, Neiman and van Overbeek took second, while the number 66 Lally TRG Porsche GT3 with Ballou, Collins, Flanagan, Henzler & Lally at the helm took third.

Next stop for us will be the six-hour American Le Mans Series at Laguna Seca on May 22nd.

I hope to make this monthly recap a recurring column in the Naut. At this point in time, however, it is probably more important for me to answer a few frequently asked questions. Additional questions can me sent to me directly at kucharskimb@yahoo.com. I am happy to field both Autocross and Performance Driving School topics; however, Joost Perquin has taken over the PDS program.

When will LSR host our own AX point series?

Four to five years back, the actual PCA attendance at LSR AX events was less than 25%. The question was asked why LSR was putting forth the effort to host events when our own members were not participating in the events. The decision was made to stop the AX program at that time.

During the interim, the local BMW chapter has offered PCA members the same benefits as their own members, i.e. pricing, early registration, etc. This information was conveyed through our calendar and the upcoming events pages. However, PCA participation continued to be less than ten drivers per event.

Our program was dormant until late 2008, when we held a Practice AX in conjunction with our PDS event. In 2009, we held three practices in similar format. These events were held at both Gulf Greyhound Park and the Houston Police Academy.

For 2010, we have teamed up with the BMW Club and will be sponsoring three timed autocrosses that will serve as alternates for their point series. LSR members are welcome to participate and will be scored as "PCA" class. If LSR participation increases, we will create additional classes for scoring purposes.

Our upcoming events are May 16, July 10, and November 14 and will be held at the Houston Police Academy. We are also planning a practice event this spring, a Time Trial at Grand Sport Speedway, and a Rental Car Shootout AX event at Baytown.

All local Houston autocross events will be announced at www.dlbracing.com. DLB is the official site and will contain registration links.

But to answer the original question, that really depends on how the club membership participation progresses. Members often tell me at practice events what a great time they have had and how they can't wait to come again. Unfortunately, life usually gets in the way of this participation. To date, there are only a half a dozen consistent members that participate in PCA and BMW events. This is a growing pain of rebuilding the program. If you would like to ensure the continuation or longevity of the program, please join us.

Where can I find more information on Autocrossing?

The best source of information is to visit the www.lsrpca.com website and look under the Autocross page. Equally beneficial is to attend one of the local events, either as a participant or spectator.

Additionally, I have posted reference books on our website for those eager to read up on the subject.

I would like to volunteer. How can I help?

If you are more of an email / phone call type of person, there are plenty of pre-planning logistics that must be arranged: registration, portacans, site reservations, etc. If you are more of a hands-on type, there are many jobs that can be assigned for event day. Some of these require early arrival at the site. They include: On-site registrar, timing setup, track setup, technical inspector, and student instructor, to name a few.

I would like to participate, but I am a complete novice. Will someone be able to help me?

Yes. We always have a pool of instructors available to gently lead you through the day. Usually one person will be designated the Novice Coordinator, and will perform a guided course walk, discuss seating positions, help you with loaner helmets, arrange for an instructor to ride with you, and be your point of contact for any questions that might come up.

What are the prerequisites for driving in an AX?

You must me a licensed driver, age 16 or older. There are no classroom or school requirements.

How do I need to prepare my car?

Showroom stock vehicles are common participants at AX events. A list of technical inspection requirement can be found on the LSR website. The actual tech inspection will be performed on-site as part of the registration process.

How do I select a number?

Available numbers can be found during the registration process on www.DLBRacing.com.

How much does an event cost?

Typical registration is \$25 for members and \$35 for nonmembers. This varies depending on the site rental fee and the type of event being held, i.e. AX vs Time Trial.

January Autocross Recap

The Houston BMW CCA chapter held the first event of 2010 at HPA on January 31. There were 65 drivers on hand. Unfortunately, due to a scheduling conflict with our Lemons car, I was not able to attend. However, I hear the weather and conditions were near perfect.

Top PCA time was held by Alex Wier in his 2006 Cayman S at 47.575 seconds. He was followed by Michael Dreiling's 2010 Cayman at 48.788; James Glasscock's 1999 996 at 50.707; Cheng Lee's 2007 Cayman at 51.714. Our single Lady's Class driver was Nancy Wier, who co-drove the 2006 Cayman S to a best time of 68.220.
