



During the final phases of planning this year's Boxstoberfest event, I realized the closing day fell on 9-11-2011 – the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tragic events that unfolded at the Twin Towers in New York City, the Pentagon in Washington DC, and rural Shanksville Pennsylvania. I felt a calling to do something to honor the local Fredericksburg first responders, as they are just as important to the residents of the Texas Hill Country as those who responded during 9-11. These Men and Women do just the same thing as those on 9-11; they go into harm's way while the rest of us are leaving. Boxstoberfest has enjoyed the graciousness of the Fredericksburg community for 14 years, and being one of the coordinators I felt we needed to do something to give back to the community.

For a few weeks, I thought - how can we do anything? None of the organizers live in Fredericksburg? I called John explaining what we were doing and asked if he might help by providing coffee, and within 3 minutes asked one





# DIY and CHEAP fix for a creaking 996/986 lower control arm

The front, lower control arms on the 996/986 are notorious for making an awful racket when the dust cover on the end becomes old and dirt accumulates inside it. We found this on the <u>986forum.com</u>, and thought we'd pass it along.

The most expensive way to fix a squeaky or creaky control arm is to replace it. If the bushings in the center or the back end are cracked, you should do just that. However, If they look good, you may want to save money by using this quick and very cheap fix:

A. Determine that the source of the creak is coming from the lower control arm.

B. Remove the wheel and locate the dust cover indicated by the red arrow in the picture.

C. Using an new, sharp razor knife, make a small incision in the side dust boot.

D. Find your trusty can of WD40, insert the little red tube that comes with each can, and squirt some in that hole.

E. Put your wheel back on the car and forget about that annoying noise for six months or so. Repeat as necessary.

As with any non-Porsche approved tip we offer, use this information at your own risk.

### His story:



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


After all, it took us until Saturday night to figure out how to operate the windows and self adjusting doors properly. Sunday it was time to get back onto Westheimer Parkway

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
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
