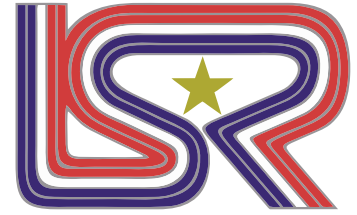
LSRPCA is a key supporter of the Drive for Kids charity event and we ask you to consider joining us. Details can be found on pages 12-15.

The Hyatt Regency Baytown welcomed us with enthusiasm, reserving its conference center parking lot exclusively for LSRPCA. With its prime location overlooking the Baytown Marina and the iconic Fred Hartman Bridge, the venue could not have been more picturesque.

Some participants wisely took advantage of the Hyatt's discounted room rates, enjoying a shorter morning commute and a little extra rest. For the rest of us, the longer drive meant more time behind the wheel of a Porsche — a pleasure in itself.

We were thrilled to have strong support from our event sponsors: European Auto Techniks, Specialized Car Works, Auto Direct, and Dry Ice Detailing Pros. A heartfelt thank-you also goes

THE COMPETITION

The field featured 36 cars across 11 divisions, all vying for trophies and points in the 2025 annual division competition. Highlights included:

- Division 2: Three classic 914s, including the earliest car of the day — a stunning 1970 yellow 914-6. Fun fact: at the 1970 Le Mans, 914-6s finished ahead of the 911Ss.
- Two 1986 models — a black 911 Cabriolet and a red 930 —



representing the earliest "911s."

- A diverse lineup featuring two 968s, a 928 S4, a vibrant group of red 964s, five 996s, and no fewer than nine 997s split into three competition groups.

- Modern marvels like a Cayman GTS, Boxster GTS, Boxster 25, GT3 RS, and Spyder RS, rounding out the field.

- Thanks to Specialized Car Works for displaying the 2025 Porsche Classic Competition Restoration National Champion 2004 Speed Yellow GT3 they helped prepare.

What a spectacular showcase of Porsche heritage and performance.

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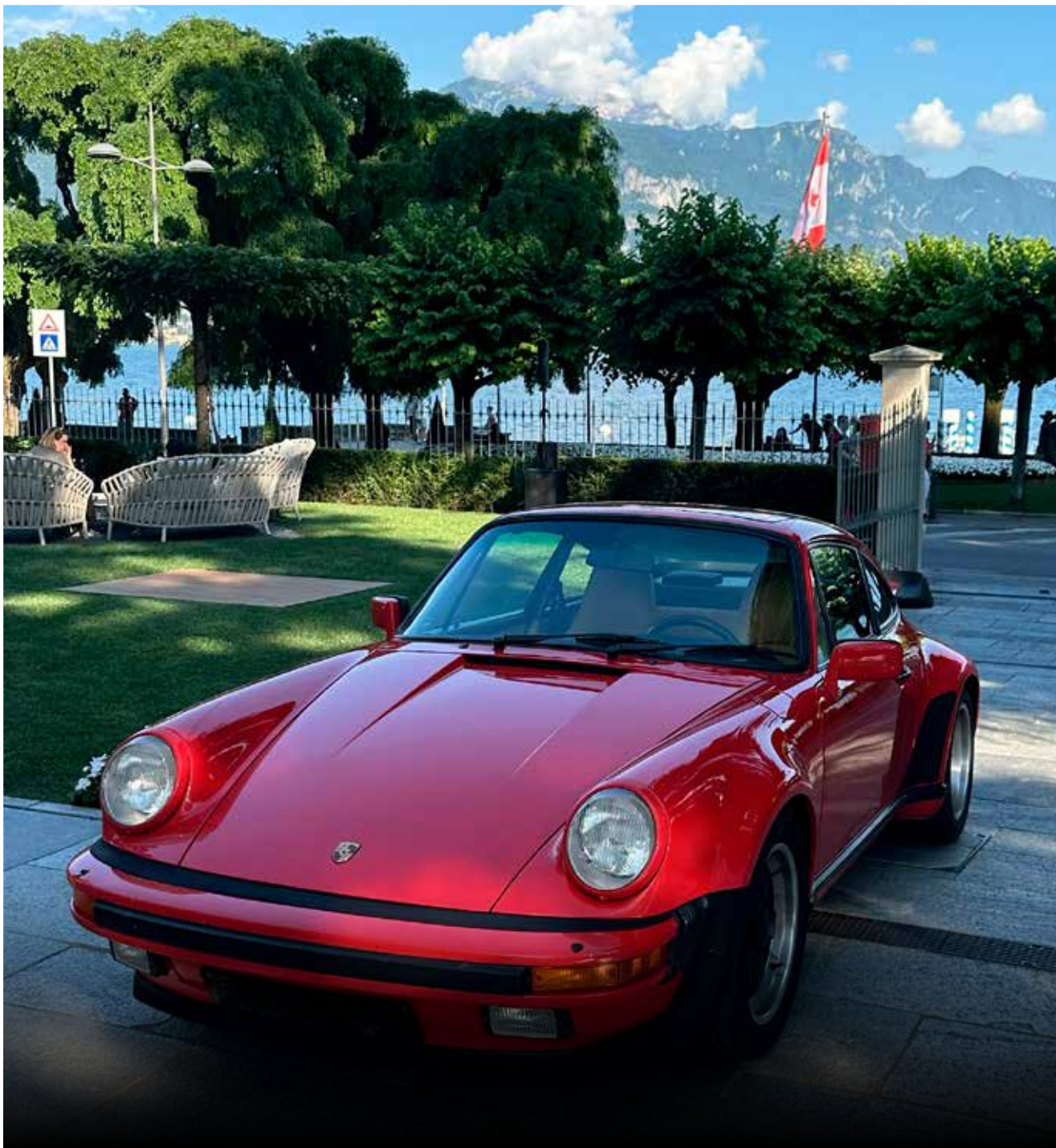


EVENT ORGANIZER:



< OUR EURO TRIP >

There's something undeniably romantic about a European road trip — winding through ancient cities, alpine passes, and flying down the famed Autobahn, all while behind the wheel of a Porsche that's as much a piece of history as the destinations themselves. Our 1,610 miles of adventure began in the quaint town of Oldenzaal, Netherlands, where we took delivery of a Guards Red 1986 Porsche 911 (930) Turbo. Researching the car's history, we learned it was a U.S.-spec model, originally delivered in California and brought back across the pond in the '90s, where it spent most of its life in a collection located in Poland. The original plan was to ship the car to the States immediately, but once we discovered we could obtain a temporary tag, valid for several weeks throughout the European Union (EU), we knew a road trip was in our future.

OLDENZAAL, NETHERLANDS

With a Porsche PCCM Classic Radio in tow, we flew to Amsterdam and made our way to Oldenzaal via train and, ultimately, Uber. The first order of business was upgrading the stereo so we could more easily use our phones for navigation and music during the trip. Don't worry — we kept the original radio for the purists. With close to 90,000 miles on the speedometer, we bought this car to drive and wanted it to be as enjoyable as possible.

COLOGNE, GERMANY

Exhausted from our 12 hours of travel and two hours at the classic car dealership in Oldenzaal, we drove two hours to Cologne, Germany, where we stayed at the Grand Hotel Schloss Bensberg for our first night. Having never been to this region of Europe before, I wish we had planned a longer stay and a down

day after our travel. On the upside, the coupe looked stunning on the cobblestone driveway outside the historic hunting lodge.

STUTTART, GERMANY

The next morning, we had our first taste of the Autobahn, where the nearly 40-year-old Turbo hit 120–130 mph regularly, with power to spare. We quickly learned the brakes worked just as well when we narrowly avoided striking a mature buck crossing the Autobahn on our way to Stuttgart to visit the Porsche Museum. It was a frightening moment, and for a second we thought our trip might end as quickly as it had begun — but thankfully, no Porsches were harmed.

In Stuttgart, we stayed at the Radisson Blu: Porsche Design Hotel and visited several automotive museums, including the Porsche Museum. It was surreal to see our car in the parking garage, then walk inside and find another Guards Red 930 coupe displayed on the museum floor.





ZURICH, SWITZERLAND

From Stuttgart, we headed to Zurich, Switzerland — closer than one might expect. Growing up in Texas, we are no strangers to 10-hour road trips, but driving from Stuttgart to Zurich took just two to three hours. We stayed at The Dolder Grand for several days of downtime. The highlight for my wife (aside from the views and the spa) was running into Queen Latifah, who was there for an AI conference. We selected all our hotels, including The Dolder, based on the availability of secure parking garages where we knew the car would be well cared for. From Zurich, we originally planned to head to Lake Lucerne or Geneva but changed course when we realized Lake Como was just as close.

GRIMSEL PASS AND FURKA PASS

Lake Como had long been on our bucket list, and we decided to take the scenic route via a few mountain passes. Within an hour of leaving Zurich, we were off the highway and climbing the Grimsel Pass, which led into the Furka Pass. With snow on the mountaintops and hundreds of waterfalls cascading down the Alps, the views

from the winding mountain roads were breathtaking. The 930 performed beautifully, even as patches of snow still clung to the ground at the summit, where we stopped for photos and a break. The car fared better than the driver, though — repeatedly shifting the tall gears of the 4-speed through tight hairpin turns was demanding, but absolutely worth it. After a cup of hot cocoa and a snowball fight, we descended into Italy.

MENAGGIO, ITALY

As we approached the Italian border, we instinctively grabbed our passports, only to realize that crossing from Switzerland into Italy (or any EU country) is much like crossing a state line in the U.S. — little more than a sign marking the transition. Menaggio, on the north shore of Lake Como, features narrow streets and cobblestone drives. Most visitors walk through the town, as there's barely room for a car — even one as narrow as ours — on some of the roads. After the longest driving day of the trip, we finally arrived and stayed at the Grand Victoria, which offered arguably the best view and the best spa of the entire journey.

SUSTEN PASS, GOTTHARD PASS, AND THE BLACK FOREST

Heading north again through Switzerland, we tackled two more legendary passes – the Susten and the Gotthard – before crossing into Germany’s Black Forest. Driving through its slow, winding

roads, we encountered such dense fog that it felt eerily like being inside a Brothers Grimm fairy tale, which this region is said to have inspired. There were long stretches where we saw no other vehicles and could barely see 20 feet in front of the car.

NÜRBURG, GERMANY

With a few days remaining, we checked the Nürburgring off our bucket list and hoped to take the 930 for a lap. Unfortunately, vehicles with temporary plates are not permitted on the track, so we settled for a hot lap in a GT3 RS driven by a professional. All I can say is: wow. Our driver pushed the car to its limits through every corner. My wife’s lap time of 7:16 beat mine, earning her the unofficial “King of the Ring” title for this trip. The experience left us eager to return and drive the Ring ourselves.

AMSTERDAM, NETHERLANDS - GTA

From Nürburg, we drove to Amsterdam to drop the car off with our international shipper, GTA (Global Transportation Amsterdam). For \$2,000, it was placed in a 40-foot container alongside three other States-bound cars and shipped to Houston. Door to door, the journey took five weeks – three weeks on the dock in Amsterdam and two weeks at sea.

HOME SWEET HOME

Once the car arrived in Houston, we picked it up at a receiving station off I-10. The registration process was straightforward, as the car had an American VIN and had been originally registered in the U.S. We felt EUROTRP was a fitting name, perfectly capturing the spirit of our adventure. We loved exploring the European countryside and have already planned a follow-up trip – this time as part of the Porsche European Delivery Program with my wife’s 2025 Cayenne GTS – but that’s another story. 🌟

While Rob Leslie may be a new face in the Lone Star Region PCA, he's certainly no stranger to high-performance machines. Now enjoying his fifth Porsche, Rob's love affair with cars began at age 16 in southern Indiana, behind the wheel of a 1956 Chevy two-door. That moment ignited a passion that has burned brightly ever since, carrying him through decades of motoring enthusiasm across continents, marques, and milestones.

During his early years in the military, Rob's garage reflected the spirit of American muscle, with a Chevelle SS and a Nova defining that era of raw power and freedom. Later, practicality entered the picture as he pursued higher education, opting for dependable VW and Honda models while attending university.

After completing advanced degrees at UC Santa Cruz and Columbia University, Rob was ready to launch his professional career — and reward himself with something special. His first Porsche, a pristine red-on-black 1970 911S, marked the beginning of a lifelong admiration for the brand. Living in upstate New York at the time, Rob had the perfect landscape to experience the 911's legendary balance and handling on the region's rolling hills and winding backroads.

A move to Houston in the mid-1980s prompted another shift in his automotive lineup, as practicality once again took precedence with a Mazda RX-7. Over the following years, the realities of family life brought a steady rotation of station wagons, Suburbans, and minivans — vehicles chosen for utility rather than excitement. Yet, as any true enthusiast knows, the passion for driving never truly

fades.

When the opportunity arose, Rob returned to performance machines, rekindling his love of sports cars through Corvettes, Mercedes-Benz models, and BMWs. In 2009, Porsche reentered his life with a 2009 Carrera S, followed by a 2015 911 Turbo S — each showcasing new levels of performance and refinement.

His enthusiasm for American muscle never waned, as evidenced by two Corvette C8s, one of which was extensively modified for maximum power and track-ready performance. More recently, a 2024 Cayman GTS briefly joined the collection before Rob once again found himself drawn to the unmistakable thrill of the 911.

Today, Rob's garage is home to a 2019 911 Turbo S (991.2), delivering an exhilarating 580 horsepower through its seamless all-wheel-drive system. With effortless acceleration, dynamic drive modes, and unmistakable Porsche character, it's a car that perfectly suits a lifelong enthusiast who still relishes every mile behind the wheel.

As Rob settles into the Lone Star Region PCA community, he looks forward to sharing the road with fellow members on club tours and events. The region proudly welcomes Rob Leslie — a true driver's driver whose passion for performance continues to define his automotive journey. 🌟

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As lifelong car enthusiasts Tor and I had heard a great deal about Monterey Car Week (MCW) over the years. Attending this singular, world-class event was very much an item in our “bucket list.”

So, when Porsche of River Oaks invited us to attend the 2025 event as their guests, we were absolutely thrilled. No video, description, or photo can fully capture this event's scale. There is simply nothing like it anywhere in the world.

Our Porsche experience had a proper start on Friday August 15th with a visit to the PCA Werks 2025. The eleventh edition of this unique event was also a celebration of PCA's 70th anniversary. What a surreal event! We had never seen anything remotely close to that in all our decades as auto enthusiasts,

regardless of brand. The sheer number and quality of Porsches was jaw-dropping – in fact, our jaws dropped many times during our MCW experience! The 2025 event featured Targas through the years as well as the 912 model.

Held at the Monterey Pines Golf Club, the event gathered over seven hundred of these amazing vehicles, everything from the very first cars to the latest iterations. Special editions, unique colors, 1-of-1 cars, famous cars, and everything in between. In the PCA's own words, the 2025 Reunion was “another record setting event bringing over 12,000 enthusiasts”.

WHAT IS MONTEREY CAR WEEK?

Simply put, it is an auto enthusiast's paradise, an annual



celebration of automotive excellence like no other! MCW spans 10 days, and its many events take place in several locations throughout the Monterey Peninsula. The public calendar features dozens of events, many of which are open to anyone with a purchased ticket. About every single car manufacturer has a presence at this prestigious event, and everyone who is someone in the automotive world attends MCW. We met several of our 'heroes' including Harry Metcalfe (founder of EVO Magazine and "Harry's Garage") and Jason Cammissa, who turned out to be just as friendly and fun in person as he is in front of the camera.

You will also get to enjoy a variety of satellite events, classic car races, rallies, firsthand activities, and exclusive auctions hosted by renowned auction houses like RM Sotheby's and Gooding & Company. Automakers and collectors participate with displays, seminars, and lectures on automotive history, design, and innovation.

"THE QUAIL" AND "CONCOURS D' ELEGANCE"

Of the 'public' events, "The Quail" is the most prestigious one of all, a highly exclusive car show limited to a carefully curated selection of automobiles. It is also the most limited in terms of ticket availability since there is an attendance cap. If you manage to get tickets to this incredible event, you are guaranteed an unforgettable experience. MCW culminates with the "Pebble Beach Concours d' Elegance" (CdE) and its unparalleled display of antique, classic and special cars.

Porsche treated us to all the main events including access to "The Quail," "Pebble Beach Concours d' Elegance" (CdE) and access to the Porsche VIP Lounge overlooking the jaw-dropping CdE display. We received invitations from other industry leaders to join a number of satellite events, such as an exclusive preview of a concept supercar that has not yet been revealed.



HOW TO ATTEND MONTEREY CAR WEEK

The 2026 event will take place from Friday August 7 to Sunday August 16. Information and tickets are already available on the respective websites (see bottom of article for links).

Ticket availability for an event can be restricted by Porsche, if you attend through them, or by the individual event organizer. If you have a strong relationship with other manufacturers and industry play-

ers, you should also contact them to learn about their participation in MCW and how to gain access to their private events. We also received invitations to participate in two outstanding private events organized by Hagerty.

That being said, there are multiple options available for you to join in this unique experience:

1. Public events: Some events like "The Quail" will sell out quickly



so plan to purchase early. A list with all the public events is found at the MCW website. Many official car clubs will also organize their own events (e.g., PCA Werks), so be sure to look into that as well.

2. By invitation:

A. Porsche dealership: If you have a strong relationship with an official dealership you may inquire about their MCW plans and how you could be invited to enjoy the experience as their VIP guest.

B. Other industry players: We were also invited to attend private events by a couple of others, including our insurance company (Hagerty), who treated us to two amazing events.

3. Purchase from dealership: Some manufacturers may make tickets available to purchase by clients. These tickets will give you access to the manufacturer's private events, lounges and more, so that is another way to experience the VIP options.



WHERE TO STAY

As with the ticket situation, whether you are staying at a hotel or rental, you will want to book early. MCW welcomes many thousands of guests from all over the world, and everyone wants to stay close to the action. Do not expect to find a bargain. As expected, the MCW is a huge revenue generator for the business and towns around the Monterey Peninsula. Dates for next year's show are published right after the current year's show closes, so bookings start many months in advance. 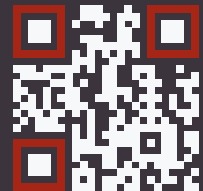
