





It's a clear and crisp early Sunday morning in February, with the sun rising over the horizon at the Buc-ees in Waller, Texas. Following a fun Kings Bier Haus make-up 2023 Concours in January we kicked off the 2024 LSRPCA Concours series at the popular Kemah Boardwalk and had another great day of Porsches and People! To start off we had great support from the Kemah Boardwalk Staff providing their entire front parking area, tents and tables, always great support, and from our event Sponsors Einars Garage, Ultimate Detail, and Garage Ultimate! Our Judge and event volunteers jumped in as well, can't thank them enough especially Lynn, Darlene and Emily for their smooth running of the Registration and scoring table! We could not have this event without all this support!

Early Saturday morning Concours event competitors filled the parking lot with carefully prepared Porsche cars, member spectators Porsches surrounded the competition area, and wide-eyed public spectators wandered through the field picking out their favorite dream car which we are lucky enough to drive!

The competition field of 35 cars in thirteen Divisions competed for medals and points for the 2024 annual Division Competition. The Kemah venue provided a fun destination and another great weather day for the Concours, not blue sky but no rain so a great morning. This year's event attracted 3 competitors from the Maverick Region including one time LSRPCA member Andy Kay, '79 Red 911SC who donated a Griots Detail kit to the Raffle; Scott Kellogg, Maverick Region Concours Chair/ Black 996 who also donated some great posters from the Maverick Region Concours; and PCA Zone 5 Representative Wendy Shoffits in her 2024 "Frozen Blue" Taycan! We also had Team Landeros join us from Corpus Christi in their 993 Turbo in Polar Silver. The word is out on this great Concours!

Wendy's '24 Taycan bookended a field of three 356s, the earliest being a 1957, a '73 914, a '71 911 Targa, the earliest year 911 of the field, two 968s, a 928S stick, a nice field of





964 and 993s, another of 996 and 997s, a '20 Speedster, no less than fourteen 991's divided by year into 3 competition groups, 2 Cayman GTSs, a Boxster GTS, a GT3RS, and a '23 Dakar! What a field of Porsches! The display of technology from the 356 to the Dakar and Taycan clearly represented how far Porsche engineering has come!

James Weller was our Porsche Club Junior Judge scrutinizing the 10 Scale Porsche Models in the scale competition as well as helping one of the Judging Teams. Kemah Boardwalk provided west James a free Unlimited All Day Ride Pass for his efforts! Ivan Histrov's detailed scale Porsche, which matched his Red 964, took the Scale Porsche honors and his Porsche 964 scored 1ST place in Division 5! A good day for Team Histrov! The Peoples Choice Award went to Chris Curran's 1957 Meissen Blue 356 and the Judges Choice Award went to Wyatt Smith's 1973 Silver 914.


Day 9: Fussen and Oberammergau

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## SELLER'S REMORSE



Observing my father's passion for American cars, Italian design, Swiss precision, and his family's German ancestry, I found my way in developing my very own passions and dreams. One of those passions: Cars, and one of those dreams: Driving a Porsche.

Chasing and enjoying these hobbies brought me to unexpected and wonderful moments in my life. While working on my thesis during my last year of Mechanical Engineering school, dreaming of designing cars, I met Luisa Elvira, my wife, in that beautiful package came my Father-InLaw (FIL). An extraordinary man, who would become my best friend, a friendship that lasted 20 years on this earth. This guy was the definition of cool: flew his own airplane, a club car racer, motorcycle tourer, successful businessman in farming, with an amazing network of friends, and retired at the age of 45 to dedicate the rest of his life to engage with his family and friends.

When I entered his life in 1997, of the first things we found in common was the love for racing and Porsches. He encouraged me to get my own. It took me more than a decade to reach that milestone. It finally happened in 2009 with a pre-owned Sapphire Blue 2002 Boxster, with manual transmission, it would be my first one of 8 great cars to date.

Three years later, the subject in this story arrived to the family. This was my first brand new car, bought in a Porsche Dealership (North Dallas) in 2013. It was a 2014 Base Cayman in Racing yellow with PDK Transmission. That night, I immediately phoned My FIL and sent him the first couple of photos. When he saw it, got very excited, and told me: "...lo lograste Carajito, te felicito!!.." ("... You made it Kid, Congrats!!.."), he expressed how proud he was of me, that night he decided he had the perfect excuse to fly back to the U.S. and visit.

During those days, it was very easy for both of us to find an excuse to go to Kroger, Home Depot, Walgreens, multiple times a day, every day for weeks!!, "....Ohh No, we forgot the milk...." we would look at each other, and smile :).


He went back home that summer with a pack of 6x4 photographs for his office desk, and a pendrive full of digital versions for his computer home-screen.

Shortly after my FIL left, I was on a business trip to Houston. That weekend, wandering around dealerships, I came across this gorgeous 964-Targa. I remember standing in front of it, that thing almost spoke to me, it was love at first sight. It was a sleepless night. I was trying to figure out how to get it, finding an excuse for my wife to get another car that we didn't need.

After a long stressful 12 hours, I pulled the trigger and decided to go to Carmax to sell my Cayman, and went back to the Galleria area to get my 911.

That night, I had to break the news to my FIL. The old man was not happy, he couldn't understand what I had done, changing a brand new Porsche for an old one? Soon enough the seller's remorse hit hard!! For years those remarks would come back in our conversations and later to hunt when thinking about those days. Three years passed revisiting his stories about Porsches and racing. Today, they are my most treasured moments with him. I especially remember those about the cars he raced and crashed: I almost choked one day when he told me he had crashed a 904 and a 356 in races he did with the Carabobo Automovil Club in Venezuela (photos below before and after).

A particular story that he always repeated was about his 1970 trip to the 12 Hours of Sebring, he came to Florida with his friends, to attend the race, and to see Pedro Rodriguez with whom he had developed a friendship while he lived in Mexico (My FIL's father, was a prominent politician who was expelled from Venezuela to Mexico during the Dictatorship ruling). That 1970 race in Sebring, became, as we all recognize today, as one of the most important milestones in the history of racing for Porsche, and for the development of the 917 car, but for me, was also because of knowing he got to see those cars up close, walked around them as they were worked on, with the engines growling before the start, and standing next to the greatest pilots and racing engineers of the time; like John Wyer, and his buddy no other than the Mexico legend itself, Pedro Rodriguez, Amazing!!! (below photo from right to left: Pedro Rodriguez, my FIL, Gino Martelachi)

Motorsport passion, among other things, made us best friends. In one of our last conversations about cars, in December 2015, we spoke again about that "Yellow Cayman". I wished I had never sold that car, he passed away on January 25th 2016.

Years of dormant remorse passed until a breeze Saturday noon, last December 9th 2023, we were at a restaurant in The Woodlands. I was doing my typical quick online search for Porsches on sale locally, and a wonderful moment happened again, just like 10 years before, but this time through the digital screen of my phone: It was a Cayman, in Racing Yellow, a newer and better model, an S, and the best of all in Manual Transmission with only 12k miles. I couldn't believe it!! I sweat cold for a second because it was at that very exact Carmax dealership where I sold my previous one!!. I stood up suddenly from the table, and told my wife, we gotta go!!. I am getting my car back!!

That evening, leaving the lot, I knew he was looking down from heaven, smiling and saying "...Carajito, te Felicito!!!..." 🗘

From March 7-10, 2024 over 300 air-cooled Porsches and drivers from all points of the compass converged on Kerrville, Texas for the 22nd annual Hill Country Rallye (HCR). This year's theme was "not our first rodeo" since HCR has become a highlight in the calendar for many Porsche fans, like Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Beginning Thursday volunteers arrived to help with setup and preparation, then old Porsches began arriving. HCR is restricted to air-cooled Porsches from years 1949 to 1989, distinguished by their unique sounds, appearance, and torsion bar suspensions. The oldest car was a 1954 356. 911s are most common, with 912s and 914s adding to the mix. Drivers came from as far east as Finland and as far west as California, with a strong contingent of beautifully prepared cars from Mexico.

HCR focuses on driving and talking. The daytime weather was brilliant, with clear skies and cool temperatures that required windows up in the morning, but allowed tops to come down in the afternoons. Everyone gets a double-sided route map showing 12 different Hill Country routes named after the Rennbow colors like Signal Yellow and Irish Green going from Camp Wood to Spicewood. The idea is to find some friends, find a route, and enjoy the cars, the company, and the countryside.

Spring in the Hill Country had just begun blossoming, so a leisurely driver or a passenger in a car going slightly faster enjoyed a visual treat. Texas is known for bluebonnets, and they were prominent along highway 281 among other places. Thank you, Ladybird. Mountain

Laurels were at their peak, with canopies covered in purple blossoms punctuating the hillsides, and a lovely grape Kool-Aid smell if you are downwind. Dogwoods and redbuds popped along the roadsides, and in town you could see glorious crabapples covered in white blossoms, like snowballs on sticks.

Friday I enjoyed one of my favorite Hill Country drives, going west out of Hunt along the Guadalupe River, with twists and cliff views and overhanging trees before reaching the plateau for a high-speed run. Turning further west then south on 335, one of the Twisted Sisters, we enjoyed a roller coaster ride of twists and dips, turns and climbs. A little more sedate drive east on 337 ended with lunch at the Bent Rim Grill, then a high-speed run up 187 with the glorious views east, and dancing with the Guadalupe River along 39 back to Kerrville. This is old Porsches in their element. Saturday I headed east for a two-brewer tour, with lunch at Fitzhugh Brewing and a stop at Alstadt Brewing south of Fredericksburg.

It is hard to identify highlights. Lisa Weinberger's outlaw 356 with the sumptuous interior and Colorado Grand stickers attracted lots of well-deserved attention. Mike Nesdale's new, hot-rodded 912 engine with meticulous details, like contrasting plated sheet metal screws, struck a tasteful balance between original and exotic. Paris-Dakar tributes parked on the gravel were eye-catching, if not my cup of tea. Were Cole Porter to describe the Hill Country Rallye he might say, it's delightful, its delirious, it's delectable, it's de-lovely. Come join us in 2025. •


